Welcome to the Erasmus School of History, Culture and Communication (ESHCC). We would like to inform you about the upcoming start of the International Bachelor Arts & Culture Studies (IBACS). Please read this information carefully.

## Eurekaweek: August 17 – August 20

The Eurekaweek is an introduction week for all new students at the Erasmus University Rotterdam. During the Eurekaweek you will get to know fellow students, the Erasmus University Rotterdam, student/sports organisations and Rotterdam. This year the Eurekaweek will consist of both online and offline activities in the city of Rotterdam; online because it is possible and offline if it is possible. ## IBACS introduction: August 31 – September 1

The new academic year at ESHCC starts with the Faculty introduction days. These introduction days are mandatory.

On Monday the 31st of August, we welcome all first year IBACS students. Via online meetings we will provide you with practical information about the programme and your lecturers will introduce themselves and their courses. Thereafter, you will be introduced to your mentor groups and tutorial groups. In the afternoon there will be an introduction activity on campus for those who are in the Netherlands.

On Tuesday 1 September you and your mentor group will get together (online) for more practical information. Two of our teachers have set up a nice online activity to end the second introduction day.

## Programme schedule

Courses start on **Monday the 7**<sup>th</sup> **of September**. During the first year you will participate in mandatory tutorials (with around 20 students) and lectures (with the entire class).

Our Education Office will register all first-year students for the courses of the first term. As from the second term you need to register for the courses yourself.

We will offer an online version of all our courses. Additionally, we will provide part of our education on campus, which we will adapt to meet the Dutch government measures that currently apply to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus. We will inform you late August which of our classes will take place both on campus and online.

As from the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of August you can find the timetables via <a href="https://timetables.eur.nl/">https://timetables.eur.nl/</a>. The 'help' button will take you to the manual. Please note that the timetable sometimes has last minute changes.



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## Mentor programme

For all first year IBACS students we organise a mentor programme during the first 2 terms of your first year. Mentors will help you adjust to student life at Erasmus University. Based on their own experience, they can give you advice about studying. Mentors also organise social activities so that you can get to know your fellow students better. With the help of your mentor you will settle in quickly!

## Access to ICT-facilities and the ERNA account

Upon registration all students receive a so-called ERNA access code (user name/password combination). This ERNA code provides students with access to the EURnet (the Erasmus University network) and the Internet. Furthermore, students receive a 24EUR7 mailbox, calendar and network storage. The ERNA password can be changed, if desired.
