You have been (conditionally) admitted to the Master Cultural Economics and Entrepreneurship at Erasmus School of History, Culture and Communication, Erasmus University Rotterdam, for the academic year 2020-2021. We are looking forward to welcoming you at our Faculty!

## Introduction programme

The new academic year at ESHCC starts with the Faculty introduction day on Tuesday 1 September. This introduction is mandatory (see appendix).

On **Tuesday 1 September**, the staff welcomes all new Master Cultural Economics and Entrepreneurship (CEE) students via an online meeting. You will be provided with practical information about the programme and introduced to the lecturers and their courses. In the afternoon there will be a campus tour and drinks for those who are in the Netherlands.

## Programme schedule

Courses start on **Monday 7 September**.

Our Education Office will register all Master students for the courses of the first term. As from the second term you need to register for the courses yourself.

We will offer an online version of all our courses. Additionally, we will provide part of our education on campus, which we will adapt to meet the Dutch government measures that currently apply to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus. We will inform you late August which of our classes will take place both on campus and online.

As from the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of August you can find the timetables via <https://timetables.eur.nl/>. The 'help' button will take you to the manual. Please note that the timetable sometimes has last minute changes.

#### Access to ICT-facilities and the ERNA account

Upon registration all students receive a so-called ERNA access code (user name/password combination). This ERNA code provides students with access to the EURnet (the Erasmus University network) and the Internet. Furthermore, students receive a 24EUR7 mailbox, calendar and network storage. The ERNA password can be changed, if desired.
