Dear students,

One of the first things to think about once you've moved into Lucia is register at the municipality. This is needed to receive a Burger Service Number (BSN), the Dutch equivalent of a social security number. You need this for a bank account, applying for benefits (including rent benefit), to work and to make use of services like the hospital.

If you are a Dutch student, you do not have to make a physical appointment, you can simply inform the Municipality of your move via their website: Verhuizing doorgeven Rotterdam.nl They will ask you to upload a copy of your countersigned lease agreement. If you do not have this, you can download a copy in your Milestone Tenant Portal under My Documents.

If you don't have Dutch citizenship, you will need to make an appointment to register in person. Depending on when you arrive and what you prefer, there are 2 options:

- Make your own appointment at city hall (2 minute walk from Lucia living)
- Register to go to the main campus during one of the <u>one stop shops</u>

Through this link you can check which situation applies to you and what documentation you need to prepare for your registration. If the signature on your lease agreement is older than 3 months at the time of the appointment, you can fill out the attached Tenancy Form and send it to Milestone to get signed (explore.lucia@milestone.net).

Finally, please note you can already make an appointment before arriving as the schedule might be full if you wait and you can't apply for rent benefit until you have a BSN.

Insurance

Aon insurance has offered to give several webinars on insurance in the Netherlands. They'll cover many topics, including liability, healthcare system, coverage, payment, claims and law and regulations.

This is on 2 separate days, with webinars for EU/EEA and non-EU/EEA students.
