Background and Legal Framework

This work has been made available under the terms of <u>Article 25fa of the Dutch Copyright Act</u> (Nederlandse Auteurswet).

Article 25fa of the Dutch Copyright Act, also known as the Taverne Amendment, entitles the author (maker) of a short scientific work, the research for which was paid for wholly or partially with Dutch public funds, to make that work publicly available for no consideration following a reasonable period of time after the work was first published, provided that clear reference is made to the source of its first publication.

Following a joint policy with our Universities of the Netherlands (UNL) partner institutions, research outputs of researchers employed by Dutch Universities that fall within the scope of Article 25fa of the Dutch Copyright Act are being made available online and free of charge in the relevant institutional repository, six months after their first publication, in their original published version, and with proper attribution to the source of their original publication.
