



Programme description & features

The MSc in Urban Management and Development is a 1-year English-taught multidisciplinary programme featuring four master tracks offered by IHS, Erasmus University Rotterdam. Students will get the latest insights into urban development during the first part of the program. The second part of the program offers the opportunity to gain in-depth knowledge about specific topics in the specialisations and when writing their theses.

Cities are in a constant state of unprecedented change. By 2050, more than two-thirds of the population will reside in cities. Population movements of this scale create multi-level physical, economic, environmental and social challenges. To remain sustainable, liveable and competitive, cities need well-trained urban managers in policy development and good governance. The MSc programme focuses on socio-spatial dynamics in planning, climate resilience and sustainability, governance of digital innovation and equitable access to sustainable land and housing.

The MSc programme is designed to provide students with the skills to analyse, understand and solve contemporary urban issues in their countries through fo<mark>rwa</mark>rd-looking policy-making. A key feature of the programme is the use of comparative methodologies to discuss urban issues, policies and trends from around the world. Next to high-quality academic content, the programme also equips students with knowledge of data analysis and communication skills.

Together with its partners, IHS works at the forefront of urban development. The institute advises local and national governments on urban issues, trains public service staff and contributes to the global Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) dis-

IHS works with global leaders in the field of urban development, including UN-Habitat, Cities Alliance and ICLEI. It also partners with leading universities in the Netherlands and around the world to deliver a comprehensive understanding of urban development. The institute offers its students guest lectures from different areas of expertise, such as water management, urban economics, logistics, transport, and heritage preservation, alongside other additional academic resources.

International

The IHS classroom is highly diverse, with students from more than 45 countries. They come from different fields, such as architecture, engineering, planning, economics, social science, environmental science and housing. Many participants have experience in the private and public sectors as well as multilateral and bilateral organisations and NGOs.


